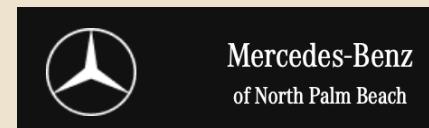

Alzheimer's Community Care's Family Navigator program is the gateway through which families access guidance for dementia-specific services and is an essential component of a comprehensive, family-centered model of care for caregivers and patients living with Alzheimer's disease.





bcalmed provides breast cancer patients with free post-operative accessory bags to manage drains after mastectomies and lumpectomies. These bags allow individuals to carry out their daily activities including showering while reducing the risk of infection.

The program serves middle class families who don't qualify for government assistance. Bella's charity helps pay for needs of children under the age 18 with lifelong permanent physical disabilities.

College Readiness Program



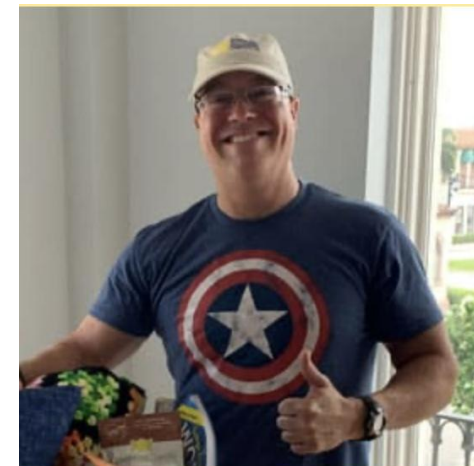
The College Readiness Program, launched in 2012, serves 6 Palm Beach County high schools, tutoring students grades 9-12 after school twice weekly in 2-hour sessions. Students are motivated, low-income, mostly minority students who are likely 1st generation college-goers.

Direct Financial Assistance (DFA) for Veterans w/ Cancer works to keep low/middle income veterans & their families financially stable & housed while they're undergoing treatment for cancer. Sums are paid directly to the vendor (i.e., the utility company), not the client.



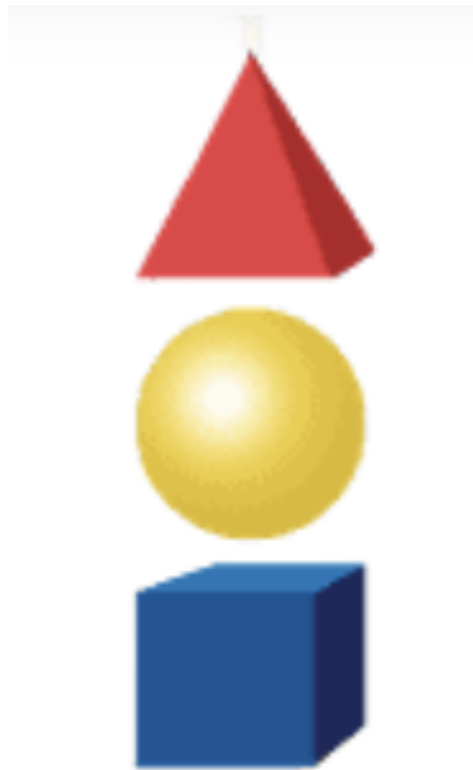
# Center for Child Counseling

The Emergency Pantry for Infants is a resource for any PBC families demonstrating need by providing diapers, baby food and formula for an infant. Families receive 7-10 days of basic needs and may access pantry services once every 30 days



# Homeless Coalition of Palm Beach County

## Creating Housing Opportunities

Creating Housing Opportunities (CHO) helps homeless families, individuals, seniors, and veterans who want to help themselves. The CHO program operates collaboratively with other service providers to deliver comprehensive services such as case management, access to 3 meals a day, transportation assistance, life skills training, and job training resources.



# Hope 4 Mobility

Special Needs Children's  
Health & Therapy Program

This project will assist with weekly pool rental cost where children with disabilities receive aquatic physical therapy from licensed and trained physical therapists.

# Paws For Liberty

## Service Dogs for Veterans



Paws For Liberty carefully screens and trains service dogs for disabled veterans with PTSD, Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI), and PTSD due to Military Sexual Trauma (MST), at no cost to the recipient.





The Family Care Program's purpose is to support families with seriously ill children receiving specialized care in Palm Beach County so that families can focus solely on their child's recovery, rehabilitation, or even end of life

Project UpLift is a free, after-school literacy program serving under-resourced children in 20 Title One public elementary schools across Palm Beach County. It targets students in grades 1–4 who are reading one to two grade levels behind and are in the bottom 25% of their class.

Concierge (FYRC)

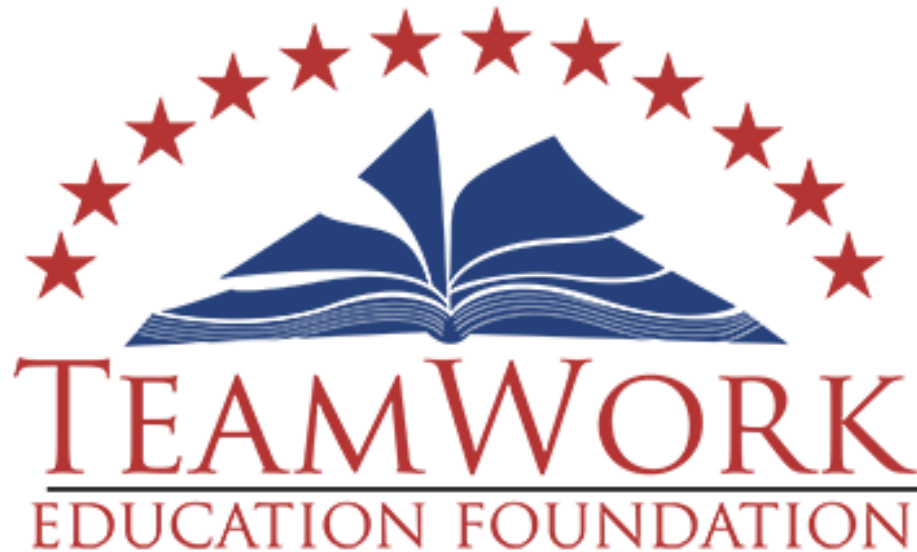

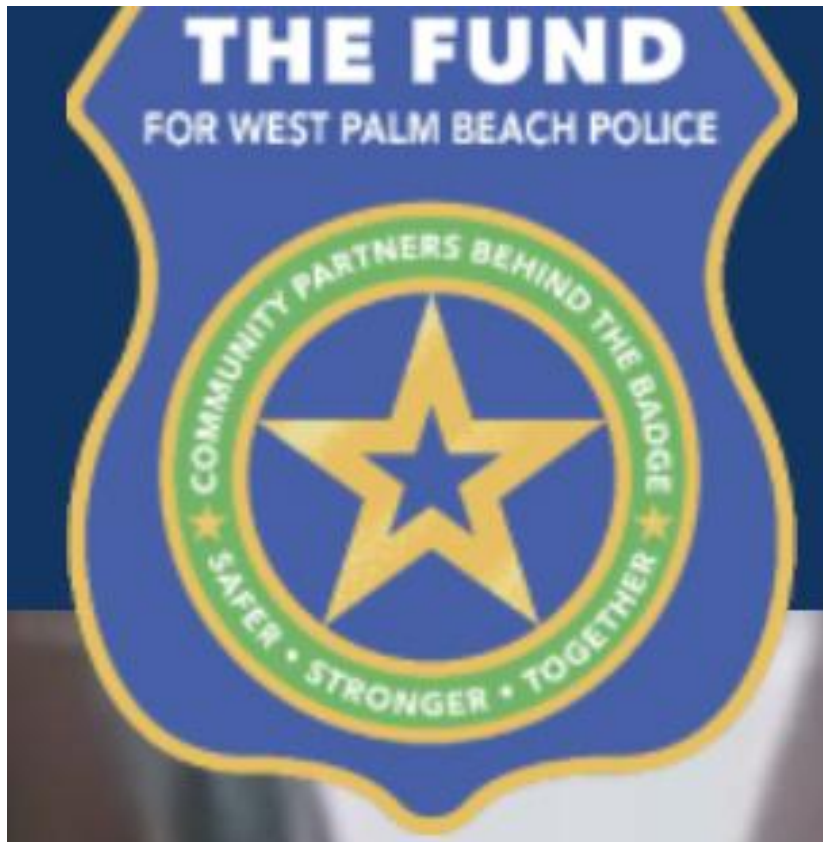

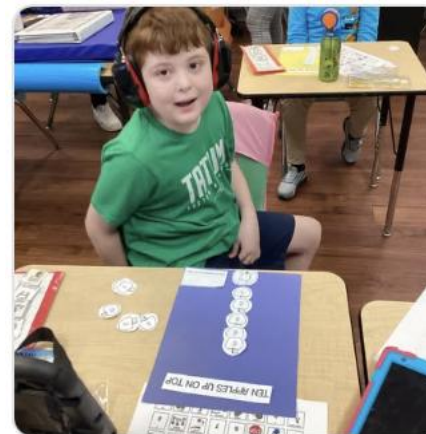

# Wounded Veterans Relief Fund

Critical Dental Care for  
Disabled Veterans

The Critical Dental Assistance Program (CDAP) funds major critical and reconstructive dental services to eligible wounded and disabled veterans. Due to strict qualifying criteria, the VA reports that more than 85% of veterans enrolled in the Veteran Health Administration (VHA) system are not eligible for dental care through the VA.
